### What do you want to be when you grow up?

Have you reached a certain point in your life and now are asking what is next?

#### Retreat Leader -- David Rich

David has designed and led a wide variety of workshops including life/work planning, career exploration, retirement planning and "What is Your Mission in Life". He is a retired PCUSA pastor and is the husband of Deborah McKinley, the pastor of the Lewinsville Presbyterian Church in McLean. David and Debbie live in Vienna.

#### Third Sunday Guest Musicians - March 16 - Tom Goss

Tom Goss never set out to become a guitar-toting, power-pop prodigy with a national fan base. A Catholic kid from Kenosha, Wisconsin, Goss had set his sights on one day becoming a priest. In 2004 this path took him to Washington, DC where he entered the seminary. Things didn't go as planned and Goss eventually put down the collar and picked up the guitar. It should come as no surprise then that the music he makes is a mix of internal struggle and hopeful spirit. Goss earned his chops in the DC coffee shop scene and has since traipsed across the country (both on his own and with his band) in his trade-mark flip flops to spread his easy-going gospel.



Goss' music often gets compared to acoustic-pop peers such as Jason Mraz and Jack Johnson but it is his lyrics that have propelled him to serious singer/songwriter status. While radio-ready, full of hooky melodies and plenty of romance to go around, Goss' music reaches out to those looking for something deeper than your standard love song. A track off his second album, "Back to Love," called "Lover" (a song that hit heavy rotation on MTV's Logo) features a video that tells the story of a soldier killed in Afghanistan while his partner waits at home. The video stars servicemen who were discharged under the recently abolished "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" policy. Goss' outspoken stance and his personal life (he married his husband Mike in 2010) have earned him a considerable following in the gay community, but his music appeals to anyone with a taste for power-pop and an appreciation for meaningful lyrics in the singer/songwriter tradition.

#### Welcome Jim Cullum to membership!

The session of IPC joyfully received Jim Cullum into membership at our February meeting. Jim comes to us from Burke Presbyterian Church, where MaryAnn formerly served as associate pastor, and has been visiting with us for more than a year. Jim is already a part of the IPC community through singing in the choir, attending the summer retreat at the lake, and he will soon be installed as a deacon. He works as an independent IT consultant.



#### Regional Leadership Gathering

Dana, Ceresa, MaryAnn and I attended the Metropolitan DC regional gathering of Next Church on Saturday, Feb. 22 at St. Mark's Presbyterian Church. It was truly an inspiring, exciting and exhausting day. Next Church is a network of leaders within the Presbyterian Church (USA) who believe our church of the future will be more creative, agile, collaborative, and diverse. As churches attendance is lessening, Next Church endeavors to creatively increase church attendance. How? By serving as a catalyst for new mission work and supporting strong leadership. We learned about a special after school program for 5-6th grade girls, Lunch for the Soul (a program that feeds then ministers to the day laborers of Herndon), and Urban Farming on unused church land (fruit trees planted by a teen mission with local school children picking the fruit and giving to local shelters and food banks). I left with my head swirling with ideas and two questions for serious contemplation:


- 1. What breaks God's heart in our neighborhood?
