As many of you know, I will be with The Well, a group of Presbyterian preachers that's been meeting since 2008. We come together for a week of scripture study--the "cost of admission" is two six-page papers about assigned scripture texts that will come up on the calendar in the coming year--which means we come away with sermon ideas for 36 Sundays of the coming year. But we also spend a lot of time gabbing about ministry, sharing our lives, eating good food (plus scotch and cigars, on the part of *some anyway...*) and laughing. I like to say that I laugh more during The Well week than any other time of the year.

Clergy groups are vital in ministry. Because pastoral ministry involves a lot of caring for others, it's important to get away for rest and renewal. The Presbyterian Church requires that churches offer four weeks of vacation and two weeks of study leave for pastors, and strongly encourages a sabbatical every seven years or so. Retreat Leader -- David Rich

Several weeks ago, about 10 IPC members took part in a Saturday retreat with retired Presbyterian pastor David Rich. David took us through a number of exercises in which we considered our individual gifts. Here are a few reflections from that event:

- -- I appreciated the opportunity to get to know folks better. We often define ourselves by "what we do" and it was interesting to see what people have done and what other people might think they would be good at.
- -- I was impressed by the commitment that folks have to feeling that they need to be doing something. I was particularly struck by Virginia's comment that "there is so much to be done and I can't do it all" or something to that effect. Sometimes we are so overwhelmed by all that needs to be done that we find it hard to begin to do anything (particularly true of housecleaning). This is an aspect of my life that I particularly have a hard time with. I deal with all the little things, but can't come to grips with the big things.


Sunday, April 6, Kate and Will, her nephew 2nd Annual Crime Victims Walk and Vigil in Fairfax.






