Dear Friends,

This month's Panorama is chock full of great stuff—a look at where we've been this summer as well as where we're going... especially our 100th anniversary dinner on October 12.

But here on page 1, I've got breaking news!

I am writing this after tonight's session meeting, during which we approved using a new schedule of preaching texts for the fall, called the Narrative Lectionary (NL). After 11 years of preaching the Revised Common Lectionary, I'm excited to tackle some new biblical texts and a new format.


The Narrative Lectionary has a four-year cycle. We will begin in year 1. Each year the NL tells the biblical story from start to finish—starting in Genesis each September, sweeping its way through the Old Testament until Christmas, then working through one of the Gospels and Acts in the spring. That means we'll delve deeply into the Old Testament this fall, and the New Testament from Christmas through the spring. The NL presents a unique preaching and teaching opportunity. When we dip in and out of the scriptures like the Revised Common Lectionary does—the prophets one week, a parable the next—it's sometimes hard to keep track of where a passage fits into the larger story. The Narrative Lectionary was designed to help people become more biblically literate and to understand the whole of the biblical story.

That's not all! We'll also be starting a discussion group after church once a month to delve deeper into these texts. On the first Sunday of the month, we will have a Bible study for youth and adults and an option for the children as well. Watch this space for details.


#### William Lee "Bill" Roberts, 94

Plan to come to IPC 11am, Sunday, August 17th to help us pack the bags.



### Thomas C. Tang Memorial Fund presents new communion service



When IPC member Tom Tang passed away on September 23, 2013, the session of Idylwood Presbyterian Church established the Thomas C. Tang Memorial Fund. Friends and family contributed almost \$1000 to the fund. After thoughtful consideration, Mrs. Linda Tang suggested that we celebrate Tom's commitment to IPC with the purchase and dedication of a new communion service. The session approved this proposal in the spring.

On July 6, the communion service was presented during IPC's worship service and utilized for the first time by Pastor MaryAnn Dana as she offered communion to the congregation. The service was manufactured by Danforth Pewter of Middlebury, Vermont and was engraved by Shirley Pewter Shop in Colonial Williamsburg, VA. Danforth pewter is handmade in America and early American Danforth pewter is in the collections of Colonial Williamsburg and the Smithsonian.

The communion service consists of a 64-ounce pitcher, two 12-ounce chalices/goblets, and two 10" bread plates. The pitcher is engraved on one side, "In Loving Memory of Thomas C. Tang, 1919-2013," and is engraved on the opposite side, "Idylwood Presbyterian Church." Each piece is engraved with a Celtic Cross and Tom's initials are engraved on the bottom of the pieces.

Linda said she suggested the donation of a communion service because she knew it was something Tom would have appreciated and she enjoys knowing that the service will be used regularly for the Lord's Supper. Linda thanks all the caring deacons for their assistance, and especially thanks Kate Untiedt for her considerable time and talent in selecting and ordering the communion service.

Hopefully everyone has had or will have an opportunity to enjoy the beautiful pewter service as you partake of communion. The photo above does not adequately capture how beautiful the service is to behold.

IPC is grateful for this generous donation to our liturgical sacraments. The communion service is a lasting memorial to the life and memory of Thomas C. Tang.
