In the post-Easter season, one of the ways we have been living into the life-giving resurrection of Jesus Christ is by allowing the truth of Romans 8:2 to become real for us:

"For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death."

In the last six months, I have found the congregation of Idylwood Presbyterian to be one of the most gracious and generous groups of people I've met; their genuine acceptance of individual differences and peculiarities is a model for diversity and should be emulated. As one member responded recently upon encountering the eccentric behavior of another member: ". . . and God loves him, too!" This inclusiveness is a gift from God!

The fallout from this generosity, which is minor but needs to be noted, is that when someone does something that really truly hurts or offends us, we don't always know how to respond. We find it easier to 'suck it up' rather than confront, communicate, or try to reconcile. Let's face it: toleration is a lot easier up front than confrontation. If we can bury hard feelings, then we don't have to see them played out in public; we have more control over them.

But it is the burying of feelings that fosters the resentments, grudges, and long-term isolation that can hurt us more in the long-run. Learning how to be both honest and conciliatory is one of the marks of a spiritually mature congregation. What do you need to share with another member? What do you need to get off your chest? How can you do it in a constructive and non-destructive way?



A few items of interest to the congregation:

• The status of pledges up to Sunday 20 March 2016.

Total pledged: \$85, 284
 Pledges due: \$19, 680
 Pledges received: \$20, 446

While the pledge s look good as of 20 March in the last few weeks incoming resources have fallen off.

- Choir loft chairs have been ordered to replace the pews. This
 will allow more flexibility for music programs. The chairs
 should be delivered by 1 June and were funded by the Larrick
 Fund.
- The 2016 NCP per capita (General Fund) and Benevolences (Larrick and Deacons Fund) have been forwarded.
- We have purchased replacement LED lights for much of the sanctuary and hope to have them installed soon. We are also looking at replacements for the main lights which will also be LED
